

Concrete Decor - The Continuing Evolution

Long a feature in custom homes, concrete decor has begun to make its way into the interiors of large-scale residential developments, often in the form of precast fireplace surrounds and tiles. On these larger projects where cost-effectiveness, consistency and value are primary concerns, the benefits of concrete are clearly felt. Cast concrete also lends an organic feel to professionally designed interiors, complementing other natural materials and creating a much sought-after sense of aesthetic timelessness.

Concrete's potential as an interior finish is only beginning to be realized. With its wide industrial use, proven history and design flexibility, there is no reason to doubt that cast concrete will find a permanent place in the homes of today and the designs of tomorrow.
